REFLECTION.

Love, Unity, and Peace.

From its inception, the first Christian community was known for its unity, and peace under fire.

One of the leaders of this community was a Cypriot named Barnabas. Selling his property, he gave all the proceeds to the apostles for the care of the poor. The Church thus set the pattern for almsgiving from which it has never wavered.

The Christian expression of love for God and neighbour was not a decision imposed on the Church by some mandatory ruling; it was the spontaneous response of hearts touched by the love of God and his generosity towards them. Freewill offering was not a way of buying prestige in Christian communities, but were prompted by gratitude and faith in the teachings of Jesus.

In this glimpse of the Church at work we marvel at its unity as well. Unity was the singular mark by which the church was to inspire the world around them. The world was never really conquered by the Roman legions, but it was injected with a vigorous new spirit by Christianity.

Christians view God's world through eyes of faith, their gaze fixed on the water and blood that once flowed from Jesus' side. Christians recognize that they entered God's family by the waters of baptism and were freed from sin and death by the blood of Jesus shed for them. They know too that they can count on the Spirit of Truth to guide them and the Church throughout the ages.

One of Jesus' last words to his apostles after being resurrected was the command to carry the gospel to the world. Along with this, he conferred on them the power to forgive sin! Yes, in those last joyful, exhilarating moments, the apostles were firmly directed to think of sin and their power to forgive it. Peace with God and with one another was one of Jesus' foremost concerns for his body the church.

In this Easter season we reflect once again on the love, unity, and gospel of peace that the Lord desires to see manifest in the church.
